The two most frequent arguments made by supporters of a human right to water are that water is crucial to human survival, and that there are already several other human rights conventions which mean water is a right because such recognized rights as the right to food are based upon the availability of water. This is true, but it simply makes clear that a human right to a resource does not necessarily imply that the resource is free or cannot be privatized. This is evident in the case of food. While food is internationally recognized as a human right, it is also highly privatized and profitable industry.
